

Montessori Materials Mystery Challenge

Objective: Encourage teachers to think creatively about Montessori materials and their multiple uses while reinforcing the principle of “following the child.”

Materials Needed:

- A basket filled with random Montessori materials (ex: pink tower cube, knobbed cylinder, sandpaper letter, bead bar, moveable alphabet letters, etc.)
- A timer
- A whiteboard or chart paper for recording ideas

How to Play:

1. **Form Small Groups** – Divide teachers into groups of 3–4.
2. **Mystery Draw** – Each group randomly picks **one Montessori material** from the basket.
3. **Challenge Round (5–7 minutes):** Groups brainstorm as many *alternative, creative, and developmentally appropriate* ways their material could be used with children across different age levels.
 - Example: A bead bar could be used for counting, pattern-making, skip counting, probability games, or even storytelling props.
4. **Presentation (2 minutes per group):** Each group shares their ideas with the others.
5. **Reflection:** Discuss as a team how this type of thinking helps teachers remain flexible and child-centered in the classroom.

Optional Twist: Add a “mystery element” card along with the material—such as “*incorporate movement*” or “*adapt for outdoor play*”—to stretch creativity even further.
