# **Weekly Lesson Plan – Preschool**

Theme: Community Helpers

#### **Developmental Domains:**

- Cognitive: Children will identify different community helpers and understand their roles.
- Language: Children will learn new vocabulary related to community helpers and practice expressing their ideas.
- Motor: Children will strengthen large motor skills (running, hopping, climbing) and fine motor skills (cutting, drawing, lacing).
- Social-Emotional: Children will learn teamwork, respect for others, and confidence through dramatic play and role modeling.

Large group	Read Clothesline Clues to Jobs People Do; discuss roles.	Sing "People in Your Neighborhood"; identify community helpers.	Invite a local helper (parent or staff) to speak about their job. Small group	Sort helper tools by category (medical, construction, safety).	Make name badges and role-play as helpers.	Puzzle play: Match jobs with places (fire station, library, etc.).	Write/draw thank-you notes to helpers.	Create a simple map of neighborhood helpers.



Outdoor activity

Practice "fire drill" movements: crawling, lining up, safe exits.

Ride bikes/scooters; talk about traffic safety.

Relay race: Carry "mail" to mailboxes.

Sandbox: Build a "construction site" with cones and blocks.

Pretend to direct traffic using signs and chalked "roads."

#### **Accommodations**

- Hearing Impairments: Use picture cards, gestures, and sign language for vocabulary.
- Vision Impairments: Provide tactile props and descriptive storytelling.
- Motor Delays: Offer adapted scissors, chunky crayons, and ride-on toys with back support.
- Cognitive Delays: Simplify tasks into smaller steps and provide peer modeling.

# **Dramatic Play**

Set up a "Community Helper Station" with hats, uniforms, clipboards, stethoscopes, and toy mailbags for role play.

#### **Fine/Gross Motor**

Offer lacing cards, scissors practice, block stacking, climbing structures, bike riding, ball play, and chalk drawing.

### Library

Include books about community helpers: firefighters, doctors, police officers, librarians, and mail carriers.



# Sand/Water Table

Add toy construction vehicles, measuring cups, and pretend medical kits for exploration.

# Art

Create hats or vests for different helpers, paint with brushes and rollers, and make handprint thank-you cards for local workers.
