# Creative Arts Lesson Plan: "Creative Art Explosion!" (Birth to Five)

# **Learning Objectives**

- Children will explore creativity and self-expression through a variety of art materials and techniques.
- Children will strengthen **fine motor skills** and hand-eye coordination.
- Children will build confidence and self-awareness by making choices about their artwork.
- Children will practice collaboration and communication skills through group projects.

# **Materials**

- Variety of art supplies: paints, crayons, markers, colored pencils, construction paper, tissue paper, glitter, feathers, pom-poms, glue, and safety scissors
- Trays, baskets, or bins for organizing materials
- Mats or table coverings for a comfortable art-making space
- Inspirational images or books featuring artwork
- Large chart paper or a whiteboard for brainstorming ideas
- Display area or wall space for showcasing artwork

## **Procedures**

# 1. Set the Stage

- Gather children in a circle and introduce the activity:
  - "Today, we're going to make our own amazing art pieces! There's no right or wrong in art—just imagination!"
- Show inspiring artwork and ask guiding questions:
  - "What colors or shapes do you see? Which ones are your favorites?"

#### 2. Prepare the Space



- Organize art supplies into stations or zones for easy access.
- Make sure surfaces are covered and safe for art-making.

#### 3. Create

- Invite children to choose materials and begin creating.
- Encourage them to experiment with textures, colors, and layering.
- Offer gentle prompts:
  - "What are you making today?"
  - o "Which materials do you like best?"

#### 4. Reflect and Share

- Bring children together to share their artwork (optional for those who prefer not to share).
- Celebrate creativity by discussing what makes each piece special.
- Display finished art on a classroom "gallery wall."

# 5. Wrap-Up

End with a story, song, or discussion about creativity and self-expression.

# **Individualized Support**

## • Infants & Toddlers:

- Offer large, safe, sensory-rich materials (soft brushes, textured paper).
- Provide hand-over-hand support and encourage exploration.

### Preschool & Older Children:

- Introduce advanced techniques like layering, collages, or themed art challenges.
- o Allow leadership opportunities by encouraging them to help peers.

## All Learners:

 Offer verbal and visual supports, dual-language labels, and adaptive tools (chunky crayons, easy-grip scissors).

# **Modifications & Extensions**

- Create a **class mural** or sculpture together to build teamwork.
- Start **personal art portfolios** so children can track progress over time.
- Take art outdoors: chalk drawing, nature collages, or leaf painting.
- Play an Art Match Memory Game using student work or famous paintings.
