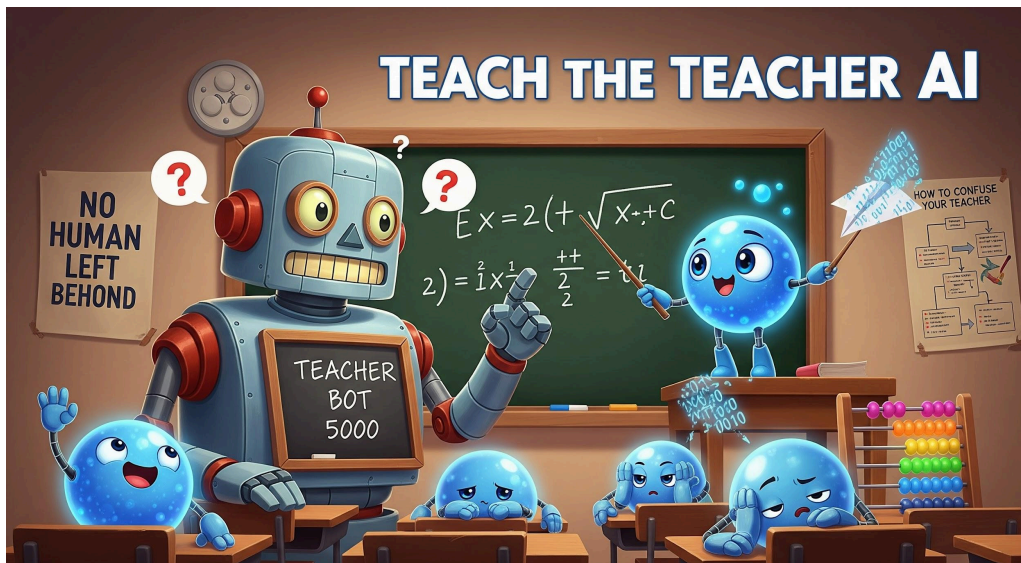


## ☀️ "Teach the Teacher AI"



This activity helps children understand how feedback shapes learning—just like Montessori-Instruct helps AI models learn better.

### Materials:

- A notebook or blank sheet of paper
- Colored pencils or markers
- A simple sorting set (buttons, Legos, beads, or even leaves from outside)

### Steps:

1. **Set the Stage.** Tell your child: *"Today, you're going to be the teacher, and I'm the student (like an AI). Your job is to help me learn better by giving me feedback."*
2. **Round 1 - The Student Tries.** The adult (student AI) sorts the objects incorrectly on purpose (e.g., mixing colors, sorting by size when asked to sort by color).



3. Round 2 – The Teacher Guides. The child observes and gives you specific feedback: *“No, you should put all the red ones together”* or *“You missed this leaf—it’s also big.”*
  4. Round 3 – Improved Attempt. The adult tries again, this time using the feedback. Let the child see that their input made the “student” improve.
  5. Reflect Together. Ask: *“How did it feel to be the teacher? Did your advice help me learn faster?”*
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💡 Why This Works:

- Montessori emphasizes children as active participants in learning.
- This activity flips roles, giving the child responsibility and ownership.
- It mimics how Montessori-Instruct lets a “student” guide how the “teacher AI” generates better practice material.
