<p>Licensed Child Care Home</p>	<p>A licensed child-care home provides care and supervision:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to seven to 12 children ages 13 or younger; • for at least: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ two hours, but less than 24 hours per day, ○ for three or more days a week; and • in the primary caregiver’s home. <p>A licensed child-care home must meet minimum standards for licensed and registered child-care homes as applicable, and receive at least one unannounced monitoring inspection by CCR per year.</p> <p>Permit type: License</p>	<p>TAC Chapter 747: Registered and Licensed Child-Care Homes</p>	<p>Information on How to Become a Child Care Home Provider</p>
<p>Registered Child Care Home</p>	<p>A registered child-care home provides care and supervision:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • or up to six unrelated children who are ages 13 or younger during school hours, and can also provide care and supervision for six additional school-age children after school hours. (No more than 12 children can be in care at any time, including children related to the caregiver.) • for at least: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ four hours a day, three or more days a week, for three or more consecutive weeks, or ○ four hours a day for 40 or more days in a 12-month period; and • in the primary caregiver’s home. 	<p>TAC Chapter 747: Registered and Licensed Child-Care Homes</p>	<p>Information on How to Become a Child Care Home Provider</p>

	<p>A registered child-care home must meet minimum standards for licensed and registered child-care homes as applicable and receive at least one unannounced monitoring inspection by CCR every one to two years.</p> <p>Permit type: Registration</p>		
<p>Listed Family Home</p>	<p>A listed family home provides care and supervision:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • for up to three unrelated children; • for at least: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ four hours a day, three or more days a week, for three or more consecutive weeks, or ○ four hours a day for 40 or more days in a 12-month period; and • in the primary caregiver’s home. <p>A listed family home must meet minimum standards for listed family homes and is not routinely inspected unless CCR receives a report alleging:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • child abuse, neglect or exploitation; • an immediate risk of danger to the health or safety of a child; • a violation of minimum standards for listed family homes; or • the caregiver is caring for more children than the permit allows. • Permit type: Listing 	<p>TAC Chapter 742: Listed Family Homes</p>	<p>Information on How to Become a Child Care Home Provider</p>
